Objectives and investment policy

The Fund aims to achieve a return based on a combination of capital growth and income by investing in UK commercial scale properties.

The Fund is actively managed by the Fund Manager who selects a portfolio with the aim of outperforming the MSCI UK Quarterly Property Index (the "Index") by 0.5% per annum on a rolling 3 year basis, before deduction of fees.

At least 70% of the Fund will invest directly in commercial scale properties in the UK market, aiming to achieve capital growth via property development and market appreciation, in addition to earning income via leasing of its property assets.

The Fund will invest in a diversified range of commercial scale property including: office buildings, shopping centres, retail units, industrial units, warehouses, land and other property types of suitable commercial scale. A small proportion of the Fund may also invest overseas.

At least 70% of the Fund will invest directly, but a small proportion may be invested indirectly through collective investment schemes (including those managed by the ACD and its associates) and other property shares.

Due to the nature of property assets the Fund may hold a portion of its assets in cash and cash like investments, and/or exchange traded property-related shares to assist in meeting the liquidity requirements of the Fund.


HBOS Investment Fund Managers Limited (HIFML) limits the extent to which the Fund's allocation across property assets (direct & indirect property, property shares) as well as across property sectors (retail, office, industrial, other) can differ relative to the market for UK properties (as represented by the Index).

The MSCI UK Quarterly Property Index has been selected as an appropriate benchmark as it measures total returns of directly held standing property investments from one valuation to the next.

Investors should aim to hold their investment in the Fund for the medium to long term (at least five to ten years). Any Income received by the Fund is paid out to you. Derivatives and stock lending may be used for the purpose of managing the Fund in a way that is designed to reduce risk or cost and/or generate extra income or growth (often referred to as efficient portfolio management). Shares can usually be bought and sold on any working day.

Risk and reward profile

The Risk and Reward Indicator table demonstrates where the Fund ranks in terms of its potential risk and reward. The higher the rank the greater the potential reward but the greater the risk of losing money. It is based on past data, may change over time and may not be a reliable indication of the future risk profile of the Fund. The shaded area in the table below shows the Fund's ranking on the Risk and Reward Indicator.



- The Share Class is ranked at 4 because it has experienced medium levels of volatility over the past 5 years.

Charges


The charges you pay are used to pay the costs of running the Fund, including the costs of marketing and distributing it. These charges reduce the potential growth of your investment.
