The Authorised Corporate Director of the Fund is Tutman Fund Solutions Limited, part of the Thesis group.

Objectives and investment policy

The Fund aims to provide capital growth greater than CPI +4% over the long term (being a rolling 5 year period)

A majority of the assets of the Fund will be invested in the shares of companies, however, at any one time may invest in any combination of the following:

- shares
- bonds issued by governments and other organisations (investment grade or non-investment grade bonds)
- property, infrastructure and hedge fund strategies

Exposure to property, infrastructure and hedge fund strategies will be achieved by indirect investment through investment trusts and collective investment schemes (which may include those collective investment schemes managed by the investment manager or operated by the ACD).

The Fund's exposure to shares of companies will be at least 50% of the value of the Fund and may include shares of companies anywhere in the world and in any industry sector.

The Fund may also invest in money market instruments, warrants, deposits and cash.

The Fund may use derivatives and hedging for efficient portfolio management (EPM), i.e to protect against market or currency movements, to reduce cost or to earn income or capital.

Income Shares: Any income the Fund generates will be paid out to you.

Accumulation Shares: Any income the Fund generates will be reinvested.

You can buy and sell shares every Thursday except for the last week in a month when you can instead buy and sell shares on the last working day of the month, or any other Business Day at the ACD's discretion, agreed with the Depositary.

The Fund is actively managed, which means that the manager has discretion over the composition of its portfolio, and the Fund is not tracking the benchmark nor is the Fund constrained by the value, price or components of that benchmark or any other aspect. The benchmark is a target for the Fund, where the target return of the Fund aims to match or exceed the return of that benchmark.

Risk and reward profile

The Risk and Reward Indicator table demonstrates where the Fund ranks in terms of its potential risk and reward. The higher the rank the greater the potential reward but the greater the risk of losing money. It is based on past data, may change over time and may not be a reliable indication of the future risk profile of the Fund. - The Fund is in a medium category because the price of its investments have risen or fallen to some extent. The category shown is not guaranteed to remain unchanged and may shift over time. - Where the Fund invests in bonds, there is a risk the bond issuer may fail to meet its repayments. This is usually a greater risk for bonds that produce a higher level of income. Changes in interest rates, inflation and the creditworthiness of the bond issuer may also affect the bond's market value. Where the Fund invests in warrants, these may be hard to buy and sell and their prices may move up and down suddenly. This could significantly impact investment performance.
- Investment trusts and closed ended funds may borrow to purchase additional investments. This can increase returns when stock markets rise but will magnify losses when markets fall. The value of an investment trust or a closed-ended fund moves in line with stock market demand and its share price may be less than or more than the net value of the investments it holds.
- Where the Fund invests into other investment funds, they may invest in different assets, countries or economic sectors and therefore have different risk profiles not in line with those of the Fund.
- Exposure to the risks associated with property investment, include but are not limited to, fluctuations in land prices, construction costs, interest rates, inflation and property yields, changes in taxation, legislation changes in landlord and tenant legislation, environmental factors, and changes in the supply and demand for property.
- The Fund is entitled to use derivative instruments for EPM. Derivatives may not achieve their intended purpose. Their prices may move up or down significantly over relatively short periods of time which may result in losses greater than the amount paid. This could adversely impact the value of the Fund. The organisation from which the Fund buys a derivative may fail to carry out its obligations, which could also cause losses to the Fund.
- The Fund may invest in securities not denominated in sterling, the value of your investments may be affected by changes in currency exchange rates.

Charges

The charges you pay are used to pay the costs of running the Fund, including the costs of marketing and distributing it. These charges reduce the potential growth of your investment.

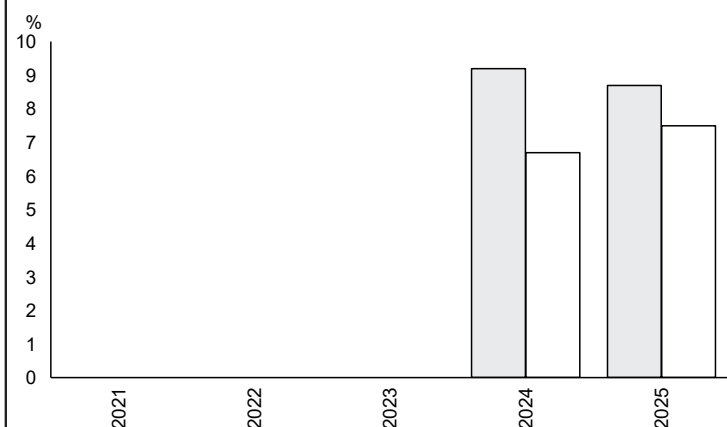

Following guidance issued by the Investment Association on 30 November 2023, any synthetic OCF now excludes the expenses of closed ended vehicles.
- A dilution levy may be charged on a purchase or sale of shares in the Fund in some cases. It may be necessary to reduce the difference between the cost of buying or selling the Fund's investments and the Fund's mid-market share price. Any dilution levy charged will be paid into the Fund.
