The Authorised Fund Manager of the Fund is Evelyn Partners Fund Solutions Limited, part of the Evelyn Partners group.

### Objectives and investment policy

The Fund aims to achieve total return (capital and income) through an actively managed international portfolio.

The Fund will mainly invest in:

- shares
- bonds issued by governments and other organisations.

The Fund may also invest in:

- derivatives
- currencies, commodities and property
- other investments funds (regulated and unregulated funds)
- warrants
- cash, deposits and money market instruments

There are no geographical or sector restrictions on the Fund.

The Fund may use also derivatives for Efficient Portfolio Management (EPM) and investment purposes, i.e. to protect against market or currency movements, to reduce costs, or to earn income or capital.

Capital invested in the Fund is at risk. The Fund will seek to achieve a positive return over a 5 to 10 year investment period, there is no guarantee that this will be achieved over that specific, or any, time period.

Total return: means that returns will be sought both from investments the Investment Manager believes may offer the prospect of, but not guarantee, capital appreciation and also from income from dividends and coupons.

Any income the Fund generates will be paid out to you.

You can buy and sell units on Wednesday of each week (except for, unless the Manager otherwise decides, the last working day before Christmas; New Years Eve and bank holidays in England), the last business day of each month and other days at the Manager's discretion.

The Fund is actively managed, which means that the manager has discretion over the composition of its portfolio, and the Fund is not tracking a benchmark nor is the Fund constrained by the value, price or components of a benchmark or any other aspect. The Fund is also not aiming to match or exceed the return of any benchmark.

### Risk and reward profile

## Charges

The charges you pay are used to pay the costs of running the Fund, including the costs of marketing and distributing it. These charges reduce the potential growth of your investment.

### One-off charges taken before or after you invest

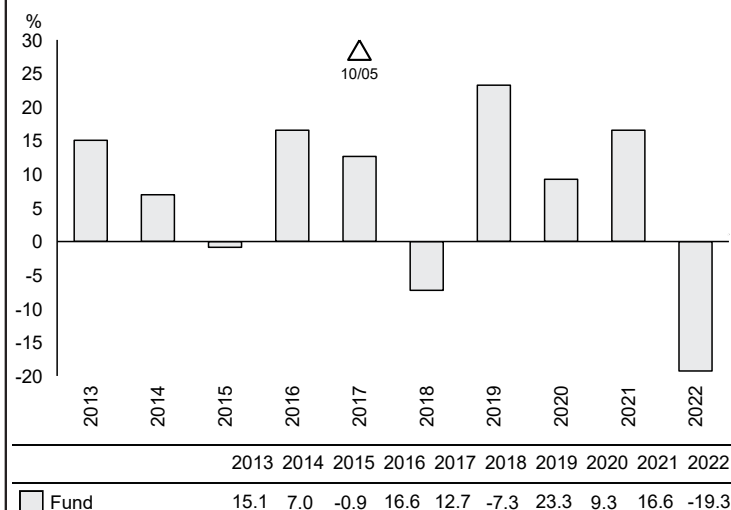

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- The ongoing charges figure is based on the last year's expenses and may vary from year to year. It excludes the costs of buying or selling assets for the Fund (unless these assets are shares of another fund).
- Previously, the Ongoing Charges Figure (OCF) included expenses incurred by underlying holdings of collective investment schemes in relation to the Fund (the synthetic OCF). Following guidance issued by the Investment Association on 2 July 2020, the synthetic OCF calculation has been expanded to include investment trusts.
- A dilution levy may be charged on a purchase or sale of units in the Fund in some cases. It may be necessary to reduce the difference between the cost of buying or selling the Fund's investments and the Fund's mid-market unit price. Any dilution levy charged will be paid into the Fund.
- The Fund's annual report for each financial year will include detail on the exact charges made.
