## S&W Saltus Fixed Income Fund X Income Shares [ISIN: GB00BLCCVY14]

The Fund is a sub-fund of S&W Saltus Onshore Portfolios.

The Authorised Corporate Director of the Fund is Smith & Williamson Fund Administration Limited, part of the Smith & Williamson group.

### Objectives and investment policy

The Fund aims to generate a return which is the higher of cash (measured by the Bank of England base rate) and inflation (as measured by UK CPI) over a rolling 3 year period.

The Fund will predominantly invest in other investment funds which themselves invest in:

- bonds issued by governments and other organisations
- currencies.

The Fund may also invest in other assets, which will have exposure to bonds and currency markets:

- transferable securities (including but not limited to shares, bonds issued by governments and other organisations)
- structured products (related to credit and designed to protect capital and deliver a specified return based on the performance of a market or asset)
- cash, deposits and money market instruments.

Investors should note that their capital is at risk and the investment objective is intended as a target and not any form of guarantee.

The Fund may use derivatives for Efficient Portfolio Management (EPM), i.e. to protect against market or currency movements, to reduce costs, or to earn income or capital. The Fund may use derivatives and forward transactions for investment purposes on the giving of 60 days' notice to Shareholders. The use of derivatives for investment purposes may alter the risk profile of the Fund.

Any income the Fund generates will be paid out to you.

You can buy and sell shares on any working day in London.

The Fund is actively managed, which means that the manager has discretion over the composition of its portfolio, and the Fund is not tracking the benchmark nor is the Fund constrained by the value, price or components of that benchmark or any other aspect. The benchmark is a target for the Fund, where the target return of the Fund aims to match or exceed the return of that benchmark.

### Risk and reward profile

## Charges

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- The ongoing charges figure is estimated because the share class has insufficient track record for us to calculate it exactly. - Previously, the Ongoing Charges Figure (OCF) included expenses incurred by underlying holdings of collective investment schemes in relation to the Fund (the synthetic OCF). Following guidance issued by the Investment Association on 2 July 2020, the synthetic OCF calculation has been expanded to include investment trusts.
- A dilution adjustment may be applied to adjust the price of shares, as it may be necessary to reduce the difference between the cost of buying or selling the Fund's investments and the Fund's mid-market share price.
- The Fund's annual report for each financial year will include detail on the exact charges made.
